

He bent down and opened his arms. "A hug and kiss for my little sis. I want to thank you for all the presents you have given to me."


"But I haven't given you anything," said Betsy.





"Yes," said Bob and Michael.


"I sure do," said Bob's Aunt Pearl.

The raft glided away from the bank. At first the water was smooth. The raft moved gently on the river.




Carolina sings softly to her horses, Porgy and Bess. The boys can hear the smile in her voice as she sings.






The Lighthouses


