





Then ripples stirred the lake's surface. The ripples spread out in ever widening circles.


Nicole and Michaelene hugged each other tightly. Their eyes were glued to the lake's surface.

"And I love the taste of fresh-dug clams cooked on hot rocks," laughed Larry.



The snow sparkled like a million tiny stars.


Michaelene's black kitten, Midnight and Nicole's skunk, Shadow peeked out. The pets were inside the girls' parka hoods.

The travelers watched the fog from the glass enclosed main deck. Then a breeze scattered the fog and they went up to the open top deck.


"I love the salty wind," laughed Michaelene.

"Let's go to the lodge for some hot chocolate," said Adam.


So they went inside the lodge. They drank hot chocolate. The skiing pals sat by the warm, cozy fireplace.




"I like the gentle sway of the train," said Nicole.


The Lobsters

The Subway


The subway is a train. It travels very fast. It travels above and below ground to many parts of a city.
