




The Boardwalk

Kamaal, his sister Angela, and their parents Dr. and Mrs. Kyrala were walking. They were walking along the Boardwalk.


The Boardwalk is a wooden sidewalk next to the Atlantic Ocean in Atlantic City. The Kyralas felt a soft breeze from the ocean.

A lot of other pals are at the party too.







The Eagles


The huge nest was in a tall tree. It was an eagle's nest in Bombay Hook Refuge.

Mama and Papa Eagle had beautiful brown feathers. Their head and tail feathers were white. When the sun shone on their white-feathered heads they looked bald.


Papa and Mama had woven large branches together to make the nest. Then they softened it with leaves and moss. Two yellowed eggs were in the nest.


Chapter I

The party begins!




at the end of her beak. It was shaped like a knob.

What do you think the young eagles felt? Write a story about it.




Ms. President laughed. Then quietly she said, "You children are today's joy and tomorrow's hope."

What can you do to make our world a more peaceful and loving place? Write a letter to your family, governor or president with suggestions.




The Airplane

"Grandma, I wouldn't forget our party!" laughed George. "A party for kids! What did you say about us?"


The White House
